Course Description: We welcome all to World Religions 101. Religion has not only existed and influenced human behavior since ancient times; it has also expressed itself in diverse ways. This course will present a survey of the origins, historical developments, teachings, and current status of some major world religions. In the course, we will explore the differing ways in which religions are used to interpret life and reality. The religions to be examined include Hinduism, Islam, Christianity, Judaism, Buddhism, Chinese religions, and Indigenous religions. We will particularly explore the lives, practices and teachings of great religious leaders associated with these religions to highlight their interpretations of life and reality.
